CREATING A CULTURE OF OPERATIONAL EXCELLENCE AND IMPACT

From 2010-2014, Land O'Lakes International Development managed 31 agriculture and enterprise development projects in 21 countries, which were funded primarily by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and USAID's Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance (OFDA). These projects were implemented in Africa, Asia and the Middle East through partnerships that generate economic growth, improve health and nutrition, and alleviate poverty. At our core, we aim to be a leader in transforming lives by replacing poverty with prosperity, and dependency with self-reliance.

- > **990,859** rural households supported.
- > **1,062,171** individuals directly assisted.
- > **203,695** farmers adopted new/or improved farming innovations and techniques.
- > **57,768** jobs created or strengthened across value chains.
- > **662,067** individuals received training to strengthen their agricultural productivity and food security.
- > **1,318** organizations applied new and/or innovative technologies or management practices.
- > **\$79.5 million** was leveraged to enhance investments in agriculture and economic growth activities.
